ACTIVE SECURITY PATROL KEEPS FIA SAFE

NOPD crime reports support the fact that we live in one of the safest areas of New Orleans. Year to date, 44 crimes have been reported within FIA boundaries, compared to 131 reported for the Marlyville-Fontainebleau neighborhood (the larger surrounding area used for city planning and other official purposes).

For the first quarter of 2010, only 5% of crimes reported for the 2nd District occurred in FIA's immediate neighborhood. Second quarter district-wide numbers were not yet available, but we hope to share those soon.

The majority of incidents are property related: Simple Burglary or Simple Burglary of Residence (12 reports), Simple Burglary of Vehicle (8), Simple Criminal Damage (6), Theft (4) and Auto Theft (3). Two incidents were

personal crimes: an aggravated battery and an armed carjacking that occurred earlier this year.

Help keep our neighborhood safe—report all crime, no matter how minor it seems. Call 911 to report an incident in progress or 821-2222 for non-emergencies.

One of the reasons we enjoy relatively low crime is the Fontainebleau Security Patrol.

Patrol members fund the hiring of off-duty police officers; but all neighbors are served by the patrol, which provides a regular, visible police presence. While our officers are on duty, they respond to our neighborhood's emergency calls and often arrive well before the unit dispatched by the 911 operator.

The current number of patrol members sustains 22 hours of coverage every week. Dues-paying members receive special benefits, including a yard sign, the patrol's schedule (information that will never appear in an e-blast to insure our area's safety), and the ability to call the on-duty officer for "meet me at home" service during patrol hours.

The number of patrol hours depends on the number of patrol members. Dues are \$168 twice a year (\$336 annually or \$28/month), and we are actively seeking new members.



Dear Fontainebleau Improvement Association members,

District A's meeting on New Orleans Recreation Department (NORD) reform was held on August 24th. On October 2nd, voters will decide on a proposed change in the City Charter to reform NORD. Tuesday's meeting was an exceptional opportunity for residents to learn more about this proposal and ask questions of those who have worked on NORD reform and studied recreation departments in other cities.

I was joined by Councilmember-at-Large Arnie Fielkow, and NORD Citizens Advisory Panel (CAP) Chair Rod West, for this important discussion. Though visionary in some ways when it was formed in the 1940's, today NORD presents shocking disparity among recreation facilities, programming, and funding across the City. Many of our children are growing up without the benefits that good recreation mentoring produces in young men and women. I support the work of NORD CAP, which promotes a more modern organizational structure, similar to the award winning recreational department in Baton Rouge, to begin building positive momentum and new recreation opportunities to improve quality of life for all New Orleanians.

Some residents at August 10's very well attended District A Community Meeting on the budget with Mayor Landrieu requested more information about the proposed NORD reforms and the meeting on August 24th provided those answers. Thanks to everyone who attended these important meetings.

I will be attending events citywide in the days around August 29. I know this time of year is a poignant one for many of us. I will pause to remember the day but remain committed to looking and moving District A forward.

54 Fontainebleau Drive



You may not know Donald and Cathy Espenan, but you certainly know their house. It is the one that is appropriately decorated for every holiday. They cover all of the traditional ones, but also some fringe holidays, including the Alabama vs. Florida Football game, an important interfamily rivalry. Donald loves to decorate and does not skip an opportunity to do it.

However, if Donald had his way, they would never have become a fixture on Fontainebleau Drive. In 2004, Donald Espenan tried every trick in the book to not buy the house that Cathy had been eyeing. In May, 2004, after having three different inspections and then writing an offer that he was confident would be rejected, their offer for 49 Fontainebleau was unexpectedly accepted.

The house, built in 1918, was badly in need of updating, but they knew it had good bones and they both really liked the neighborhood (Donald grew up nearby.) They knew the house would be a big project, but they also knew that they now had plenty of space for friends and family to come visit.

As, Cathy said, "if we buy it, they will come."

Immediately, they began work. First, they renovated the bathrooms. Says Donald, "the bathroom floors were in such bad shape that I was worried someone would fall through the floor when they were sitting on the toilet."

In August of 2005, when people began to evacuate for the coming storm, they made the decision to stay in their home. They boarded up all of the windows and prepared for the approaching unknown. When the storm arrived, they sat inside and listened, as their roof blew off piece by piece while they sat inside unable to see what was going on outside.

As soon as the winds and rain calmed, they went out to inspect the house, the neighborhood and to see how they could help their neighbors. Fortunately, Donald had the foresight to bring their wave runners home.

The water continued to rise over the next 24 hours or so,

topping out just under the wood floors of their raised house.

In the aftermath of the storm, they continued the renovations of their home, with the added challenge of repairing all of the storm damage. But, determined to finish what they started, they persevered.

They continued by changing the windows to new insulated windows (customized to match the originals), remodeling the kitchen and the living room. They also recently coated the entire house with RhinoShield exterior coating. Next they hope to build an indoor laundry room.

Now they have a new problem - all of the hooks for the decorations were removed during the exterior work. Donald, ever committed to dressing their house up for the holidays is plotting new ways to install decorations without damaging the beautiful exterior. He says, his goal is to be "less Al Copeland and more...well, I'm not sure what."


